

The risk of objects inside the vehicle becoming projectiles

What are the dangers of loose objects in vehicles?

- When a car crashes at high speed one of the **greatest dangers comes from loose items** thrown around the cabin
- When a car stops suddenly in a crash, objects inside keep moving and can **impact at up to 20 times the force of gravity**. A 1 litre water bottle carries the force of a 20kg object.

Unrestrained passengers in a vehicle can also become projectiles in the car. If you are in a car crash, your chance of fatality **increases by as much as 25%** when another person in the same car is not strapped in.

Tips

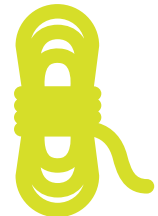
Stow things in your **glove box or centre console** so that they are easily accessible



Large or heavy items should be **stored in the boot**



If you have a hatch back or station-wagon, invest in a **cargo barrier and high quality nets or tie down straps**.
