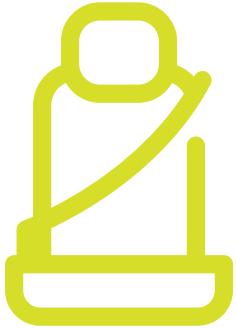


Wearing your seatbelt could save your life

Why is it important to wear seatbelts?



Wearing seatbelts is compulsory, not a choice. Modern cars are fitted with seatbelts for all seats, including rear seats. They must be used.



20% of all fatalities on Australian roads involve no seat belt being worn.



When the driver is unbuckled, **76% of children** also ride unbuckled. When the driver is belted, **87% of children** also ride with a seat belt.

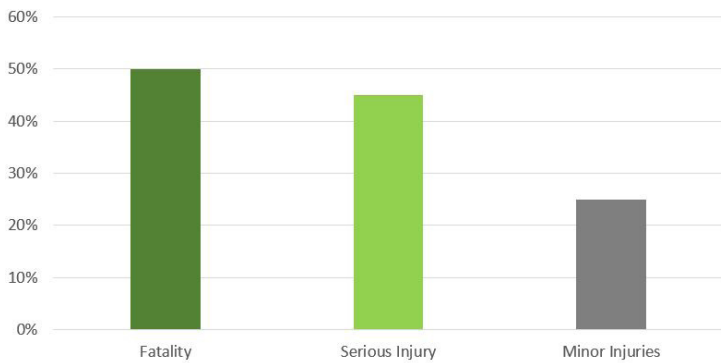


50% of people involved in fatal crashes where a seatbelt is not worn have been drinking.

Effectiveness of Seatbelts for Drivers of Cars and Vans



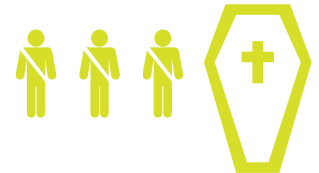

Risk of serious injury

In a crash, unbuckled passengers can become a projectile and increase the risk of hurting or killing others in the car by **40%**

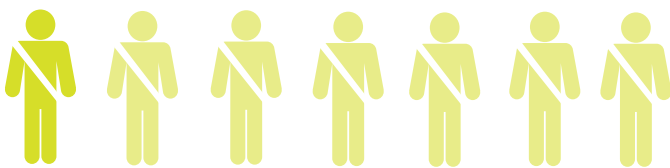


3 out of 4 people who are ejected during a fatal crash die from their injuries.
